Prepare and present a presentation about your Paper 3 subject. The presentation should be roughly 12 minutes in length. (Ten to fifteen minutes is fine.) Your presentation should *not* be a reading of your paper, but instead a summary of your research, presented as a lecture.

I encourage you to use visual aids, particularly for emphasizing the structure of your talk. Possible ways of accomplishing this include the chalkboard, a poster (with huge letters), and PowerPoint.

You should place a high premium on engaging the entire class, through your material selection, word choice, vocal inflection, eye contact, and body language. You should be prepared to field questions from the class following your talk.
